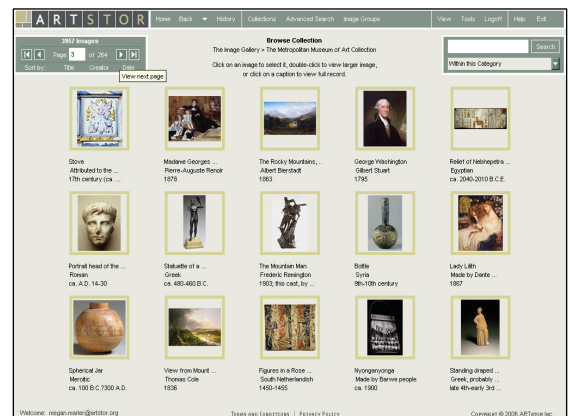
Need images for research and instruction? Having trouble finding quality digital images? What image presentation software alternatives do you have?

ARTstor is a digital library of nearly **one million images** with a set of tools to view, present, and manage images for research and pedagogical purposes. Image content can be browsed or searched, saved or downloaded, exported or used in ARTstor's offline image viewer (OIV). Thousands of images are added each month, comprehensively covering all cultures and time periods, from a wide range of collections, museums, archives, and libraries.
