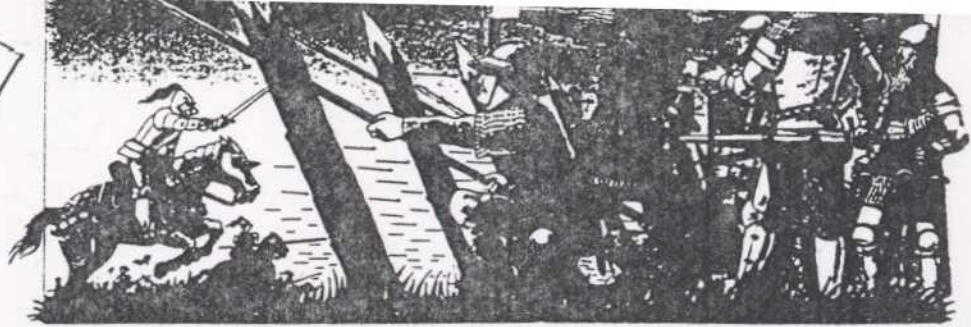
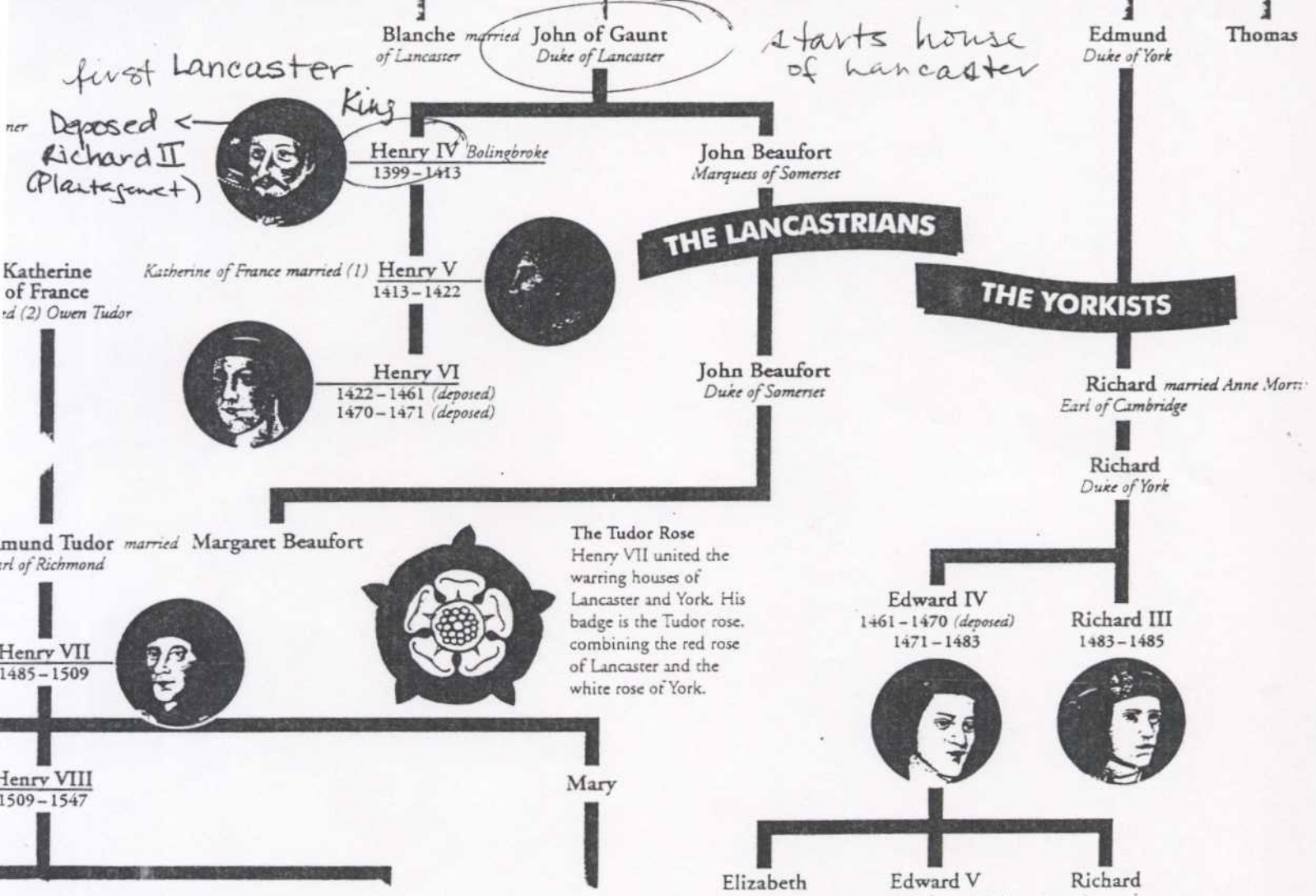
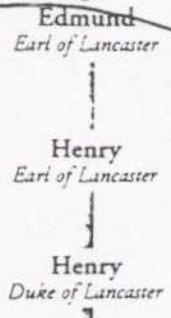
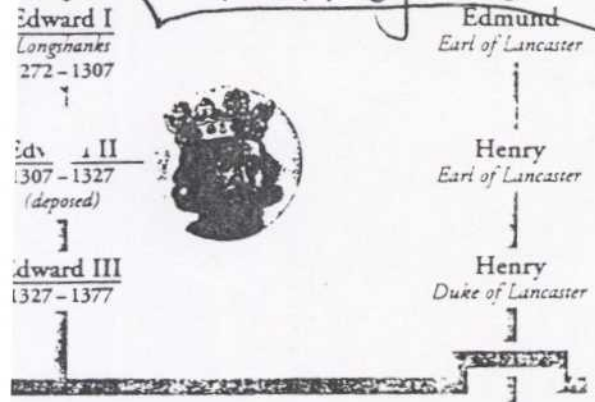


Plantagenet

The French army was overwhelmed by a rain of arrows from the British longbowmen, under Henry V's command.



When Henry IV wishes that "some night-tripping fairy had exchanged / in cradle clothes our children where they lay, / and called mine Percy, his Plantagenet," he identifies himself with the house of Plantagenet (l.i. 87-89). Although Henry IV is the 1st Lancastrian King, he is descended from Plantagenets.
