The Kieth E. Vineyard Honorary Scholarship

This scholarship is given in memory of UCSB alumnus Keith Vineyard, who graduated in 1985 summa cum laude with a B.A. in History. His friends and family established this scholarship to recognize his courage and grace while battling cancer and to honor his uncompromising character and integrity in matters of friendship and family. Thus, in tribute to his profound love of and gift for writing, this scholarship is awarded yearly to an undergraduate who demonstrates outstanding creative writing skills.

- ✓ The contest is open to **all UCSB undergraduates** who have registered for at least 12 units in at least one quarter of the current academic year (Fall, Winter, or Spring).
- ✓ Each winning short story will be selected solely on the merits of the submission.
- ✓ Between one and three winners will be selected. First place receives \$700, second place \$300, and third place \$100.
- ✓ Entries must be neatly typed and should not exceed 6,000 words.
- ✓ Your **name must not appear on the manuscript!** Instead, your entry must be accompanied by an entry form, available on the [English Department Contest Page](#).
- ✓ Only one submission per person.
